They are asking permission to hold a portion of the race in the Town of Cochecton. They will provide insurance and paid safety police. Hopefully this event will take place every year.

MOTION: On motion of Councilperson Richardson, seconded by Councilperson Grund, the following motion was to authorize the Supervisor to sign the contract for the Sandy Hookers Triathlon Club and Split Second Racing to hold a portion of their event in the Town of Cochecton. All voted in favor

- 2. Fuel Management It will cost approximately \$6,000.00 \$6,500.00 to purchase the equipment and approximately \$1,200.00 \$1,500.00 for installation. The system can keep track of fuel used in each vehicle, mower and other town owned equipment. The system may be able to be purchased off state bid. Several other towns are using this system. This system can help track the usage and keep a better record of what it cost the town to run the highway department. It could possibly be utilized by other entities in the town as well. Councilperson Richardson asked if utilized by other entities could the town add a certain fee per gallon to recoup some of the cost. It is possible to add approximately 5 cents per gallon. It is worth looking into the fuel management system.
- 3. Front doors -- New Town Hall –Supervisor has called Sullivan County Glass to see what kind of quote the town could get to fix the moisture problem. Waiting for the quote.
- 4. Article 78 received one bill for \$200.00 for work in December.

Town Board wants to speak to the Assessor re: the data Collector position being a contacted or employee position. This was discussed. The Board wants input form the Assessor and the Attorney as to which way to handle this issue.

PUBLIC COMMENT:

<u>Christopher Warner, Cochecton Estates</u>, mentioned he was invited to this area in February 2012 and fell in love with the area, has since purchased property and wants to build a home. Gas drilling an issue he is not against or for it, but if it can be done safely he would be OK with it.

<u>Holly Dang, Cochecton Estates</u>, Fracking is in our face and the benefits don't outweigh the cost. Wants to raise a family here, would not want to if gas drilling comes here
