On motion of Councilperson Grund, seconded by Councilperson Story, the following resolution was WHEREAS, due to a coding error on abstract # 1, Line H 1620.402 (Capital Account Town Hall) in the amount of \$1,181.25 should have been in Line A 1620.402 (Contractual New Town Hall) thereby making the Capital Account Town Hall read \$0.00, and

WHEREAS, there was an additional error in mileage reported at the wrong rate of reimbursement making a reduction in the General Funds of \$3.06 due to the error, now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED, that to correct the General Funds by adding the \$1,181.25 and subtracting the \$3.06 the General Funds should now read \$7,614.14 correcting the errors

Attorney gave copies of the leases for the two ball fields to the Supervisor to be signed.

MOTION: On motion of Councilperson Richardson, seconded by Councilperson Grund, the following motion was to authorize the Supervisor to sign the lease agreements for both ball fields, Douglas Heinle and the Cochecton Men's Club, to lease the ball fields for FY 2011 for recreational purposes. All voted in favor

CEO and Town Board members discussed the unsafe building on State Route 52 in Lake Huntington. The CEO and the Attorney suggested the board accept the lowest bid for the removal of the building, but will give the property owners some additional time –weather has been a factor –if the CEO is not satisfied with the project by the February 9, 2011 meeting. He will advise the town to move forward within one week (February 16, 2011) to remove the structure.

MOTION: On motion of Councilperson Grund, seconded by Councilperson Richardson, the following motion was to accept the bid submitted by J. Hughson Excavating, Inc. in the amount of \$6,200.00 for the removal of the unsafe structure on State Route 52 in Lake Huntington; with the above stated stipulations. All voted in favor

CEO spoke to Mike Popolillo from American Electric, and he will need a change of work order, as the wires specified in the original plans are reversed, where they had # 6 wire it should be # 12 wire and where they had # 12 wire it should be # 6 wire.

Councilperson Richardson suggested the Town Board document everything that was wrong with the plans from the Engineering firm.

New Town Hall –Electric Company completed hookup.

The Justices have decided on a clerk for the Justice Court, from the three names submitted and based on the interviews they have picked Elaine H. Loewe to fill the position; and have asked the Town Board to appoint her as their Court Clerk.

MOTION: On motion of Councilperson Grund, seconded by Councilperson Story, the following motion was to appoint Elaine H. Loewe to the position of Town of Cochecton Justice Court Clerk as requested by the Justices. All voted in favor.

At this time the Town Board held a discussion re: the color of the shutters for the New Town Hall. After some discussion it was decided that the shutters would be burgundy.

Supervisor Maas is having 3 different companies giving him quotes to supply the telephone service for the New Town Hall. It has been suggested that there is a need to at least double up on the wiring. Bedik Communications, Inc. gave a quote of \$2,750.00 for 15 additional voice and/or data drops as a ball park figure. For the telephone system with automated attendant/voice mail and ten (10) telephones in the following locations: CEO/Building Inspector, Supervisor, Bookkeeper, DCO/Tax Collector, Assessor, Planning Board, Kitchen/Conference Room, Town clerk, Court clerk and lower level, the cost of such a system would be \$3,975.00. This system is built to

accommodate up to 8 lines and 16 telephones allowing plenty of room for future changes and/or expansion. The total cost in the proposal is \$6,725.00.

Supervisor mentioned that Superior said the same thing about the wiring, had a quote of \$1,650.00 for wiring and \$110.00 per line for the system for a total price of \$5,321.79.

Supervisor is meeting with Universal Communication tomorrow and should have a quote by Friday for consideration.

The web designer has submitted a bill in the amount of \$1,925.00 to begin to develop the website as per her contract. Plus \$102.00 for the URL's for one year; for a total of \$2,027.00.

MOTION: On motion of Councilperson Richardson, seconded by Councilperson Grund, the following motion was to authorize the Supervisor to prepay W Design the \$2,027.00 to move the project forward.

Old Business:

- 1. New Town Hall latest update—discussed earlier
- 2. Comprehensive Plan and Zoning update (Shepstone) -- he did not send Dave Soete the information and he has stated he will have a reasonable amount of the new Zoning Law printed.
- 3. Town Web Site -- The Town Board members went over the different pages that Councilperson Story made for the proposed website as requested by the Supervisor, as to what the town would like on the different departments and other information for the web site. There were some changes made and Councilperson Story will make the changes/corrections and forward them to the Supervisor who in turn will advise Dorene Warner the web designer.
- 4. New Town Hall Furnishings –Blinds, refrigerator, microwave –this will be discussed at the next meeting.
- 5. Public Hearing Zoning Laws need to wait until we have all the information before setting a Public Hearing
- 6. Phone service for the New Town Hall –discussed earlier

New Business:

- 1. Lumberland resolution # 150—will be on agenda for next time
- 2. Brian DuBois Highway Superintendent –truck # 22 has a broken rear; it will cost approx. \$4,000.00 to repair it. The truck is presently at Palmer & Sons to be repaired.

Councilperson Richardson mentioned that there will be Public Hearings on Feb. 22 from 6-9 or 9:30 p.m. at Liberty High School to present draft regulations for gas drilling if anyone wishes to attend.

Supervisor Maas mentioned that the Sullivan County Chamber of Commerce is looking for a name for the Pride of Sullivan County for the Town of Cochecton, and asked the Town Board to put forth some names for consideration.

The Supervisor also had a hard copy of the MMTF road use agreements.
