- **November 12, 2014:** The Council held its regular meeting on Thursday November 6.
- Following the Roll Call, Dr. Howard Whidden from East Stroudsburg University presented a program on the "Acoustic Monitoring of Bats in the River Valley". Interesting to note that bats provide billions of dollars in benefits for agriculture and society. The population of bats has dropped drastically as a result of a disease called "white nose syndrome". This devastating disease apparently only kills hibernating species. The most prevalent bat in our area would seem to be the Large Brown Bat.
- NYS DEC representative Bill Rudge briefly discussed the State Open Space Conservation Plan. Public comments on the draft plan are being accepted until December 17. It was noted that there are priority areas designated around the state. Money to support the program comes from a property transfer fee.
- Since Pennsylvania has identified several cases of Chronic Wasting Disease, NYS now prohibits people from importing into the state certain parts of white-tailed deer, elk or moose taken in PA. or Ohio.
- Even though tight restrictions are being imposed on the taking of eel in coastal waters and tributaries, a UDC appeal has allowed for an exemption in the Upper Delaware River. Although no new permits will be issued, the existing permit holders will be able to harvest eels through this next year.
